PowerPoint Presentations:

There is no limit to the number of slides but strict cut-off times will be enforced (15-minute presentation then 5-minute Q&A session). **The following slides are mandatory and should appear as ordered.** Select slides may need more than 1 slide to appropriately cover the topic.

1.) Title Slide

- IRB status (lower left corner)
- Presentation title
- Full name
- Position (PGY1 Resident, PGY2 Resident, Fellow, etc.)
- Residency Program and location

2.) Disclosure Statement (include the following)

- Full name of all investigators
- Conflict of Interest (stating that investigators have none, or stating disclosures)
- Sponsorship (did the speaker receive funding to support their research)
- Propriety information (state that the research is subject to different interpretation)
- Educational in nature (state that speaker agrees that their presentation abides by the non-commercial guidelines)

3.) Pre-Test Self-Assessment Question

- This should be the same question as your post-test question (without answer or rationale) so the
 audience is aware of what they should be focusing on during your presentation.
- We suggest making your question related to the study results.

4.) Institution

- General institution information
- Demographics (bed size, type of facility in relation to project)
- 5.) Background
- 6.) Methodology
- 7.) Results
- 8.) Conclusion/Discussion

9.) Post-Test Self-Assessment Question

One question your audience should now be able to answer related to the material presented. This
could be related to the statistical tests or interpretation of results.

Formatting Instructions:

- Use standardized slide template developed by AzPA
- Make sure all slides are numbered
- Save as Windows PowerPoint 1997-2003 (.ppt) OR PowerPoint Presentation (.pptx).
- File name should be saved as *lastname_sitename* (i.e.: smith_hospital.ppt)
 - o **Due May 15th 11:59 pm PST**
- Font incompatibilities are the most common problem with presentations.
- Hyperlinks to or otherwise integrated other files (graphic, animation, videos, other programs, etc.)
 are not allowed as this causes compatibility issues. Files that contain these elements will not be accepted.
- Easiest to read color schemes are a light background with dark lettering.
- Limit use of red color for any text since it is difficult to read.
